## **COLLEGE RULES & REGULATIONS**

1. All students must carry their identity cards and wear scrubs in college premises and hospital during college working hours. Students must follow strict PUNCTUALITY and DISCIPLINE in the College. Irregular attendance/unjustified absence or objectionable moral behavior justifies suitable disciplinary action.

- 2. All students are required to attend their Lecturers/Demonstrations/Practical's/Clinics and other classes regularly. As per DCI norms, 80% attendance both in Theory and Practical's/Clinics is compulsory to appear in University Examination. Any student falling short of attendance will not be permitted to appear in University Examination.
- 3. All students are required to appear in all Internal Assessment/Class Tests conducted by College positively. No Student will be granted leave during any Internal Assessment/Class Test except in serious cases of illness. If there is any justified ground for leave, the student has to take prior permission from the concerned Head of Department (HOD) for not appearing in Internal Assessment/Class Test.
- 4. Leave without prior permission is not acceptable. Students are not allowed to leave the campus during College hours.
- 5. It would be highly desirable that Parents/authorized guardians visit the College periodically and meet the Principal and Heads of Departments in order to know the progress of their wards.
- 6. Students are not allowed to paste any notice/pamphlet or to write any statement/slogan within the institution without prior permission from the Principal/College authorities.
- 7. No student is allowed to communicate directly with outside authorities like persons from press, electronic media, district administration, etc.; all such communications must be submitted through the Principal. Any student found violating this rule justifies suitable disciplinary action against him/her.
- 8. Students are strictly prohibited from participating in any form of Public agitation against Government /Statutory Bodies/ Universities or any other institutions or establishments.
- 9. Possession/use of narcotics, any banned drug and alcoholic beverages, smoking and gambling/betting are STRICTLY PROHIBITED inside or outside the institution by any student.
- 10. Posting of objectionable messages, photographs of the institution and self that may affect the reputation of the institution will attract strict disciplinary action including dismissal from college.
- 11. Use of mobile phones by students /staff is strictly prohibited during college hours.
- 12. Possession of any kind of fire arm/weapon, banned literature or movie CDs/DVDs, DVD player, etc. is STRICTLY PROHIBITED inside the institution. Any student found guilty shall be liable for disciplinary action.

## **HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS.**

- 1. Students should undertake that they will follow and abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel during the period of stay in the Hostel.
- 2. Students should undertake full responsibility for their behavior during the entire course of their stay in the Hostel.
- 3. Students should undertake that they shall do nothing either inside or outside the Hostel / College detrimental to orderly administration and discipline of the Hostel / College.
- 4. Students should declare that if at any point of time, I am found indulging in bad behavior or involve in "RAGGING" / attempt to rag it will attract the provisions as laid down by law / rules of University / Government and shall be liable for expulsion from the Hostel without any notice.
- 5. I hereby undertake that my conduct in the Hostel room as well as in the premises of the Hostel or outside the campus shall be such as that, it will cause no disturbance to my fellow Students / Teachers or others.
- 6. I hereby undertake accept that if, for any reason, my continuance in the Hostel is detrimental to the best interest of the Institution, the decision of Principal on disciplinary grounds shall be final.
- 7. I hereby undertake that I know very well, the absenteeism from the hostel without prior permission will warrant immediate dismissal from the hostel.

#### ANTI-RAGGING CAMPUS

- \* Ragging in any form is an offence.
- ❖ The institution has **Zero Tolerance** to any form of ragging or bullying.
- \* The students and parents are expected to give the declaration as per the guidelines given by the DCI at the time at admission.

- ❖ The punishment at the Institution levels:

Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- 2. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
- 3. Debarring from the representing the institution in any regional, National or International Meet, Tournament, Youth Festival, etc.
- 4. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel
- 5. Cancellation of Admission
- 6. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1-4 semesters
- 7. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- 8. Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- 9. Students if found to be guilty of ragging, the incident will be reported to all the concerned Government Authorities.

## Sexual Harassment is unwelcome conduct of Sexual / Physical in nature which includes:

- 1. Unwelcome sexual advances.
- 2. Requests for sexual favors.
- 3. Verbal, nonverbal, or physical conduct of a sexual nature.
- 4. Intimidate, threat, or force for unsolicited Physical contact amounting to Molestation.
- 5. Any form of advances made which interfere in the Student / Staff, Free Movement Mental Wellbeing and Studies /Work in the Institution.

### Sexual Harassment of a student also constitute when:

A. Submission to such advances, requests or conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of the individual's academic advancement, participation in Institution/School programs or activities, or is used as a basis for academic decisions affecting the individual.

- B. Rejection of such advances, requests or conduct affects a term or condition of the individual's academic advancement, participation in Institution/School programs or activities, or is used as a basis for academic decisions affecting the individual.
- C. Such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with the individual's academic performance, education, or participation in Institution/School programs or activities, or of creating an intimidating or hostile work or academic environment.

#### Examples of sexual harassment may include, but are not limited to:

- > Repeated offensive sexual flirtations, advances or propositions which are offensive
- > Verbal abuse or innuendo of a sexual nature which is continued or repeated
- Physical contact such as touching, hugging, patting or pinching which is uninvited and unwanted by the other person
- > Offensive verbal comments of a sexual nature about an individual's body or sexual terms used to describe an individual
- > An open display of sexually suggestive objects or pictures if people find them offensive
- ➤ Jokes or remarks of a sexual nature if people find them offensive
- ➤ Unwanted prolonged and apparent staring or leering at a person

You can reach AMDECH by car and public transport. The nearest Railway Station is Chengalpet Junction (approx. 9 Kms) and the nearest Airport is the Chennai Airport (approx. 36 Kms.) On Chengalpattu-Mahabalipuram Highway (approx. 9 Kms), alight at bus stand: Keerapakkam.

#### 4. Can I obtain my application by post?

Yes, by sending DD for the required amount.

#### 5. What are the minimum requirements for applying to B.D.S. course?

Candidates who have secured at least 50% marks in +2 Examination or equivalent and completed 17 years of age on 31st December of admitting year are eligible to apply for the B.D.S. course.

6. Can I apply before getting the result of qualifying examinations? Yes, you can apply. However, the marks card of the final qualifying examination must be submitted on or before the last date for courses as the admissions are on the basis of marks.

#### When is the last date for submitting the application forms? 7.

Last date is 31<sup>st</sup> May every year. Under unavoidable circumstances, the application will be accepted up to 31st July every year.
